NASC & CISRS To Exhibit at New-Look 'Scotland Works' Health & Safety Event, SEC Glasgow, May 3-4

NASC and CISRS will be exhibiting at the new-look, biennial 'Scotland Works' event – May 3-4 being held at Scotland's premier B2B event venue, the SEC – on stand HS48, opposite the main conference theatre in the 'Health & Safety Scotland' section.

NASC will be using this key industry event north of the border – which attracts 3,500+ construction and safety professionals from across Scotland, off-shore and the rest of the UK – to launch the NASC 2017 Safety Report, which summarises accident data with analysis from the confederation's 230+ member companies, and is highly regarded within the health and safety sector and the scaffolding industry.

Furthermore, NASC staff will be actively promoting the latest NASC technical and safety guidance (including the recently 50% discounted TG20:13 Good Practice Guide for Tube & Fitting Scaffolding), changes to CISRS training with the introduction of Continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses from July 1st and will also be aiming to attract Scottish and Northern Irish scaffolding companies to consider the many benefits of joining the rapidly-expanding NASC. Staff will also be distributing news releases, the NASC 2017 Yearbook, the CISRS CAP 609 booklet and the fresh-off-the-press NASC 2017 Safety Report.

The NASC & CISRS stand will feature an unmissable, 5.6m tall modular system scaffolding structure provided by Glasgow-based NASC hire, sales and manufacturing members, Turner Access Ltd.

The structure will be erected from the Turner OCTO Steel Scaffold System, designed and made in Scotland. Commercial Manager, Ian Henderson said: "This system is compliant to EN12810 and EN12811 and is known worldwide for the quality of its manufacture, safety and ease of erection and dismantle, as well as versatility in managing working at height solutions."

In addition to being providers of scaffolding to the NASC/CISRS stand, Turner Access Ltd will also be at the Scotland Works event exhibiting their lightweight Alloy products, on stand FM14.

NASC MD, Robin James said: "The confederation is hoping to kick on from a very successful exhibition at The Birmingham NEC in March also a great event here in Glasgow in 2015. This exhibition reaches a different demographic with the same safe scaffolding messages we offer from the SHE Expo at London ExCeL in the Summer and the (new for NASC & CISRS) Build Show, part of UK Construction Week in October.
