<u>CISRS Meet the Next Generation of Scaffolders North of the Border During Scottish</u> <u>Apprenticeship week</u>

A range of events have been carried out across Scotland over the last 5 days to celebrate Scottish Apprentice Week. (SAW). The event is both a celebration of current apprentices, but also aims to shine a spotlight on the benefits of work-based learning to people of all ages and backgrounds, employers of all sizes and the Scottish economy.





CISRS MD Dave Mosley took the opportunity to drop in to meet and chat with delegates currently working through their Scaffolding apprenticeship programmes at CISRS approved providers, ASET International Energy Training Academy in Aberdeen and National Construction College (NCC) Scotland at Inchinnan.
